Ann Marie Longo called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M.

Robin Dando read a brief biography on Laura Castrogiovanni, a student at Vernon, who led the meeting's pledge of allegiance. Laura was presented with a certificate for her accomplishments.

Ann Marie Longo called for the approval of minutes from the meetings of September 1st, 8th, 11th, 15th, and 29th. The minutes were approved.

Linda Ninesling gave the treasurer's report for the month of September, 2015. The treasurer's report was accepted.

Dr. Seinfeld spoke on the Vernon advanced band who were the youngest to be selected to perform at the NYSSBA Annual Convention in New York City. She expressed what an honor this was and thanked Mr. Rufa, Mr. Devasy and the entire music department for their support. Petr Rufa spoke on the selection process to be chosen to perform and introduced all those students who attended. The students were presented with certificates for their accomplishment.

Dr. Ross, PTA Council President, thanked the Board of Education for their tireless efforts and hard work for the children of the District. Along with members of PTA Council, she presented each Board member with a small token of appreciation.

Dr. Seinfeld stated that along with the administrative team she tried to come up with a way to show appreciation to the Board. She stated that the administrative team had been asked to come up with various activities to invite Board members to join over the next few weeks. She presented each Board member with a list of various activities taking place through October 31st and asked each Board member to RSVP to Mrs. Nolan by October 22nd with which activities they planned to attend.

Superintendent's Report

Dr. Seinfeld stated that she had an opportunity to hear the Commissioner of the New York State Education Department speak on updates that are planned regarding the 3-8 assessments. She spoke briefly on some of these anticipated changes which include moving to computerized testing.

Dr. Seinfeld spoke again on the Community Book Club. The shared reading experience this time is <u>Fish in a Tree.</u> She reviewed some of the past books that were read.

Ann Marie Longo introduced Marianne Van Duyne, from R.S. Abrams & Co., who presented the External Audit Report. Ms. Van Duyne stated that audit report went very smoothly and they were happy with the results. She showed a presentation of an overview of the audit, which included review of the financials, overall fiscal health and the importance of financial health. She stated that the District received an unmodified opinion on the June 30, 2015 financial statement. There were no significant deficiencies, no material weakness and all prior recommendations were implemented. She spoke on reserve funds and unassigned fund balance. The Board asked Ms. Van Duyne questions based on the External Audit Report and Mrs. Longo asked any community members who had question on the audit report to ask them at this time.

Ann Marie Longo stated that a representative from Seneca Consulting Group was present to speak on the Affordable Care Act Employer Reporting and what it means to the District. They explained a little bit about the Affordable Care Act and the responsibilities of the employer regarding offering health care to employees. He reviewed some of the mandates as well as the indepth reporting process and explained that failure to report this information on time can result in fines of as much as \$2,000 per full time employee. He explained what their service offers to the District and stated that they currently provide this service to over 70 school Districts in the area. The Board asked questions based on the presentation.

Steve Valente gave a presentation on the proposed bond financial impact. Mr. Valente reviewed the five key areas and a bond breakdown which includes \$6,990,791 for the art/music expansion and 826,000 for security enhancements; including scope of work for both projects. Mr. Valente presented the estimated tax impact of the proposed bond, current vs. future debt comparison, and financial facts relative to the bond. He reviewed bond financial facts which included old and new debt service figures stating that the District's bond rating is an AA1 which is excellent. The Board asked questions based on the bond presentation and financials.

Lisa Mulhall spoke on conversations that took place at the last PTA Council meeting involving increased relationships with local organizations such as Sagamore Hill and Raynam Hall. She stated that the fourth grade was currently working with the TR Bird Sanctuary and the Audubon Society. She thanked the PTA Council for sharing their ideas the fourth grade team for putting them into action.

The Board accepted questions and comments from the community, on agenda items, at that this time.

Mr. Castellnano spoke on the problems in the parking lots, particularly at Vernon. Dr. Seinfeld stated that this is on the PTA Council list as well. Steve Valente stated that the police are going to try to keep up their presence also. Dr. Castellano asked if the security guards could take license plate numbers as well.

Jennifer Romeo asked for an update on safety and security. Ann Marie Longo asked when the next Safety Team Committee meeting was. Mr. Cronin stated it was November 16th. Ann Marie Longo suggested that it would make sense to have a report at the November 17th meeting since it was the day after the Safety Team meeting. Things they would like a report on are: what is in place now, what will be in place six months from now and things that are not going to cost that much money should be in place now.

The Board members who attended the NYSSBA Conference spoke on their experiences and what they took away from it. Todd Cronin spoke on the fact that a lot of schools were looking into tablets and asked if the District was headed in that direction. Lisa Mulhall indicated that the big picture is to move to a one-one initiative and will be looking into this over the course of the year. Prior to this year, the basic infrastructure was unable to accommodate moving forward in many areas. However, since this has now been improved she is confident that more learning will take place online and less on paper. The Board would like to see where we are and where the District is planning on going regarding instructional technology.

The Board had a discussion regarding online learning as opposed to textbooks.

Mr. McEvoy stated that the resolution vote was very interesting but it ended earlier than planned.

The Board discussed the possibility of non-profit groups paying if extra security is needed during the times they use District facilities. They discussed which groups are non-profit.

The Board accepted questions and comments from the community, on non-agenda items, at this time.
