After much discussion Dr. Seinfeld asked the Board if they would be willing to move forward with running the AP Capstone program. Ann Marie Longo asked about the cost of the program. Dr. O'Hara explained there would be a need for teacher training. The Board agreed to look further into the AP Capstone Program. Dr. Seinfeld thanked Dr. O'Hara for his time involved in applying for this program.

Dr. Seinfeld stated that today was Superintendent's Conference Day, a professional development day for staff members. She stated that it was an unbelievable day of learning throughout the District. She thanked Dr. Mulhall for putting together an amazing day and thanked all teacher leaders who gave their time.
