Ann Marie Longo called the meeting to order at 6:45 P.M. Motion by J. Romeo, second by R. Dando to enter into executive session at 6:45 P.M.

Motion by R. Dando, second by J. Romeo, to claim out of executive session at 7:05 P.M.

Laurie Kowalsky read a brief biography on Quinn Rainey, a student from Theodore Roosevelt School, who led the Pledge of Allegiance. Quinn was presented with a certificate for his accomplishments.

Ann Marie Longo called for the approval of minutes from January 5th and January 19th, 2016. Jennifer Romeo stated that there was a difference in the salary for one appointment from what was on the agenda. The Board approved only the minutes from January 5th. Mrs. Nolan will look into this and, if needed, correct the minutes which will be approved at the March 15th meeting.

Robert Schoen, Area 11 Director from New York State School Boards Association, was in attendance to present awards to some members of the Board of Education. He presented Board members with citations for their continued professional development in their roles as members of the Oyster Bay-East Norwich CSD Board of Education.

Dr. Seinfeld again thanked the community for their support in passing both bond resolutions.

Ann Marie Longo spoke on an event held at the Tilles Center, which she and Dr. Seinfeld attended, in which Billy Joel donated one million dollars to the High School for the Performing Arts.

Dr. Seinfeld introduced Peter Rufa, who introduced and spoke about students who participated in the All County Music Festival. The students were presented with certificates for their accomplishments.

Steve Valente gave a presentation on the expenditure portion of the budget. Mr. Valente reviewed the Projected Tax Levy Limit as of 2/9/16, 0.12% which is OBEN "Cap". Call to Order Executive Session

He explained there were two options, to stay within the estimated levy limit or exceed the levy limit which requires 60% super majority voter approval. Mr. Valente reviewed the budget process up to this point. He reviewed some positive factors impacting the 2016-2017 budget which included Teachers Retirement System and Employee Retirement System reductions, TAN interest rate, health insurance premium increases and new collective bargaining agreements. Mr. Valente reviewed some known and unknown figures in the budget development process. Mr. Valente gave a preliminary estimate of the 2015-2016 fund balance, indicating that a more accurate estimate will be presented at the March 1st meeting. He reviewed some budget reduction areas and potential additions to the 2016-2017 budget. Mr. Valente explained that on March 1st the entire expenditure budget would be discussed with specific numbers.

The Board asked some questions relative to some of the potential additions. Dr. Mulhall spoke on the drama enrichment program at Vernon, currently supported by PAC. The Board asked Mr. Trentowski some questions relative to middle level crew.

Mr. Valente reviewed some ongoing needs relative to facilities, including some maintenance items, use of capital reserve funds and some future big ticket items. Mr. Valente reviewed the existing projects funded through capital reserve funds. He then reviewed potential capital reserve projects for 2016-2017. He explained that the Board must make a decision by the March 15th meeting, as the Legal public notice must be in the local papers no later than April 2nd. The Board discussed some of the potential projects. They spoke on the playground at Roosevelt, particularly replacing the slide. The Board indicated they would like to see the slide replaced by the spring and not wait. The Board discussed the floor at Memorial Stadium.

Steve Valente gave an update on the facilities projects throughout the District. He invited Pat Caffrey, who was hired as the lead security guard to join him in this presentation. Mr. Valente and Mr. Caffrey reviewed previous updates that were made relative to security in the District. They reviewed additional security initiatives in place as of January and February of 2016, which included 10 security guards hired, orientation, ordering of uniforms, radios for security personnel, and duties and responsibilities. They stated that security personnel will be assigned to schools starting February 22, 2016. Lockdown drills will be held with security staff and Nassau County Policy POP unit in early spring. District personnel will attend active shooter training in February.

The Board accepted questions and comments from the community, on agenda items, at this time.

A BOND RESOLUTION OF THE OYSTER BAY-EAST NORWICH CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, NEW YORK, ADOPTED FEBRUARY 9, 2016, AUTHORIZING THE CONSTRUCTION OF VARIOUS IMPROVEMENTS TO DISTRICT FACILITIES; STATING THE ESTIMATED TOTAL COST THEREOF IS NOT TO EXCEED \$7,816,791; APPROPRIATING SAID AMOUNT THEREFOR; AND AUTHORIZING THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED \$7,816,791 SERIAL BONDS OF SAID DISTRICT TO FINANCE SAID APPROPRIATION.

Recital

WHEREAS, at the Special District Meeting duly called and held on December 17, 2015, in the Oyster Bay-East Norwich Central School District, in the County of Nassau, New York (the "District"), a majority of the qualified voters present and voting approved Bond Propositions authorizing (i) various additions, alterations and improvements at the Oyster Bay High School at the estimated cost of not to exceed \$6,990,791; and (ii) the construction of District-wide safety and security system upgrades and enhancements at the estimated cost of not to exceed \$826,000; and further authorized the Board of Education to levy and collect a tax to be collected in annual installments to pay the principal of and interest on the not to exceed \$7,816,791 serial bonds authorized to be issued;

Now, therefore,

THE BOARD OF EDUCATION OF THE OYSTER BAY-EAST NORWICH CENTRAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, IN THE COUNTY OF NASSAU, NEW YORK, HEREBY RESOLVES (by the favorable vote of not less than two-thirds of all the members of said Board of Education) AS FOLLOWS:

New Business

Bond Resolution

Section 1. The Oyster Bay-East Norwich Central School District, in the County of Nassau, New York, is hereby authorized to construct art and choral room additions, to partially reconstruct and construct of alterations and improvements to existing music and art facilities, to install air-conditioning at the Oyster Bay High School and to construct District-wide safety and security system upgrades and enhancements; all substantially as described in a plan prepared for the District by BBS Architects Landscape Architects and Engineers PC; the foregoing to include all original furnishings, equipment, machinery, apparatus and ancillary or related site, demolition and other work required in connection therewith. The estimated total cost thereof, including preliminary costs and costs incidental thereto and to the financing thereof, is not to exceed \$7,816,791 and said amount is hereby appropriated therefor. The plan of financing includes the issuance of not to exceed \$7,816,791 serial bonds of the District to finance said appropriation, and the levy and collection of taxes on all the taxable real property in the District to pay the principal of said bonds and the interest thereon as the same shall become due and payable.

Section 2. Serial bonds of the District in the amount of not to exceed \$7,816,791 are hereby authorized to be issued pursuant to the provisions of the Local Finance Law, constituting Chapter 33-a of the Consolidated Laws of the State of New York (herein called "Law") to finance said appropriation.

Section 3. The following additional matters are hereby determined and declared:

- (a) The period of probable usefulness applicable to the purpose for which serial bonds are authorized to be issued pursuant to this resolution, within the limitations of Section 11.00 a. 97 of the Law, is thirty (30) years.
- (b) The proceeds of the bonds herein authorized and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds may be applied to reimburse the District for expenditures made for the purpose or purposes for which said bonds are authorized. The foregoing statement of intent with respect to reimbursement is made in conformity with Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2 of the United States Treasury Department.

Section 4. Each of the bonds authorized by this resolution and any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds shall contain the recital of validity as prescribed by Section 52.00 of the Law and said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of said bonds shall be general obligations of the District, payable as to both principal and interest by general tax upon all the taxable real property within the District without limitation of rate or amount. The faith and credit of the District are hereby irrevocably pledged to the punctual payment of the principal of and interest on said bonds and any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds and provision shall be made annually in the budget of the District by appropriation for (a) the amortization and redemption of the bonds and any notes in anticipation thereof to mature in such year and (b) the payment of interest to be due and payable in such year.

Section 5. Subject to the provisions of this resolution and of the Law and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bonds with substantially level or declining annual debt service, Section 30.00 relative to the authorization of the issuance of bond anticipation notes and Section 50.00 and Sections 56.00 to 60.00 of the Law, the powers and duties of the Board of Education relative to authorizing bond anticipation notes and prescribing the terms, form and contents and as to the sale and issuance of all bonds herein and heretofore authorized and of any bond anticipation notes issued in anticipation of said bonds, and the renewals of said bond anticipation notes, are hereby delegated to the President of the Board of Education, the chief fiscal officer of the District.

Section 6. The validity of the bonds authorized by this resolution, and of any notes issued in anticipation of the sale of said bonds, may be contested only if:

(a) such obligations are authorized for an object or purpose for which the District is not authorized to expend money, or

- (b) the provisions of law which should be complied with at the date of the publication of such resolution, or a summary hereof, are not substantially complied with, and an action, suit or proceeding contesting such validity is commenced within twenty days after the date of such publication, or
- (c) such obligations are authorized in violation of the provisions of the constitution.

Section 7. This bond resolution shall take effect immediately, and the District Clerk is hereby authorized and directed to publish the foregoing resolution, in summary, together with a Notice attached in substantially the form prescribed by §81.00 of the Law in one of the District's official newspapers, hereby designated the official newspaper for such publication.

The adoption of the foregoing resolution was seconded by Board Member Laurie Kowalsky and duly put to a vote on roll call, which resulted as follows:

The resolution was declared adopted.

Dr. Seinfeld thanked Rob Brusca, Kevin Hanifan and Mr. Venditto for the work on the snow removal along Route 106 over the winter.

The Board discussed the process of going paperless and receiving Board packets electronically. Dr. Seinfeld explained that the board would be assigned OBENSCHOOLS e-mail addresses. For the time being, the Board will receive both electronic and hard copies of the packet/agenda.

The Friday packet was discussed. Jennifer Romeo asked about responses to e-mails. The Board discussed APPR; Ann Marie Longo asked why there was an extension; Dr. Mulhall explained. Todd Cronin asked a question regarding personnel that were out during the snow storm.

The Board accepted questions and comments from community members, on non-agenda items, at this time.
