Additional Security Initiatives In Place as of September 2016



- 17 security guards currently employed
- Currently utilizing the same guards at the same schools as last year
- Lead Security has regular meetings with guards updating any issues and protocols
- ❖ 70% are being utilized at schools during school hours
- ❖ 30% are being utilized for sports, special events etc.
- At Sports events guards are wearing yellow jackets to be more visible

Safety Plans and Drills September 2016



- September 1, 2016- District wide and Building safety plans updated and complete
- October 15, 2016- District wide and Building safety plans filed with appropriate agencies. (State and local Police departments)
- ❖ The district will be compliant with the new state mandate of 8 total drills to be conducted by December 31, 2016
- Staff is currently being trained and updated on lockdown and lockout drills.

ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES

- At all schools security has implemented signs, cones and plastic barriers to control traffic and provide a safer environment
- These changes have been a minimal cost to the district
- ❖ In High school student Parking lot, cones at entrance of west side
- Over summer months the parking lots at Vernon and Roosevelt were painted for better visibility and safety for drop-off and pick-up
- Additional parking at Roosevelt Building east side?

Security Camera System



- System monitored daily by the Lead Security district wide for any issues or problems
- ❖ Added new camera to the entrance of the Butler building at Vernon School
- Lead security changed some of the protocols between district and Intralogic. Any system issues are emailed to Lead security and followed up by Intralogic support.

ALERT DOMAIN AWARENESS (ADAS)



- ADAS is a system that will assist in better communication with the Nassau County PD during an emergency situation
- Nassau PD will be able to view district cameras while PD is in route to the OBEN school buildings sending alert to 911
- Is there a deadline to sign up for this system?
- How many Nassau County districts have signed up?
- What are the specific costs and technology requirements for our school district?
- Is there any potential liability for the district?
- How do we know that the 911 call has gone through?
