- The content of art has evolved

- The field of education has evolved

 - > Focus on higher level thinking

Applies to a foundational arts course used to earn the 1 unit of arts credit required to graduate high school

In addition to the CGEL standards, applies to those courses used to fulfill a 3 or 5-unit sequence in the arts

High School Level I (HSI) – Proficient

High School Level II (HSII) – Accomplished Applies to a foundational arts course, used to earn the 1 unit of arts credit required to graduate high school

In general, applies to those arts courses beyond the foundational level; used to guide and assess the 2nd- 3rd units of credit in an arts sequence

High School Level III (HSIII) – Advanced In general, applies to those arts courses beyond the accomplished level; used to guide and assess the 4th- 5th units of credit in an arts sequence


