Laurie Kowalsky called the meeting to order at 7:00 P.M. Motion by M. Santos, second by R. Dando, to enter into executive session at 7:01 P.M. Motion by R. Dando, second M. Santos, to claim out of executive session at 7:35 P.M.

Dr. Seinfeld indicated that it has become a tradition to honor some six grade students at a Board meeting each year. She introduced Dr. Vacchio who introduced Mr. Kevin Trentowski who spoke on three Physical Education awards that were going to be given to six grade students. These were the Heinz Posch Award, the Scholar Athlete Award and Nassau Zone NYS AHPERD Award. He explained a little about each award and introduced the recipients of these awards. Dr. Seinfeld indicated that certificates will be mailed to all students being honored this evening. Dr. Vacchio spoke about the SEPTA Extra Mile Award, SEPTA Student of Distinction Award and the Vernon After School Friends Program. Dr. Vacchio introduced Colleen Kelly and Caitlin Dillon who announced the recipients and spoke about their accomplishments. Dr. Seinfeld thanked Ms. Kelly and Ms. Dillon for the work they do with the students.

Dr. Seinfeld indicated that the next item on the agenda is the topic of college acceptance and the senior class. She gave some highlights from an outcome report that was included in the weekly Board packet. She stated that as of May, 2020, 97% of students had applied to college and 88% of students will be attending a four-year college, which compares to 73% in 2019. She stated that this was a goal set for this year. She thanked Dr. Mulhall, Ms. Lasher, Ms. Meehan, counselors, students and families for their hard work in reaching this goal. Although the Nassau County breakfast honoring valedictorian and salutatorians will not be held this year, she and Ms. Lasher will be holding a socially distance celebration. Dr. Seinfeld sated that she has a video she will share with the Board of valedictorian and salutatorians which also indicates the schools they will be attending.

Dr. Seinfeld spoke on the budget vote and canvassing of ballots. She wanted to make sure the Board had seen the memo from Ingerman Smith. She thanked Ms. Nolan, Mr. Cipriani and Mr. Butler for all their hard work in terms of putting this all together in such a short time frame. She shared that as per the guidance the ballots cannot be counted before 5:00 P.M. on June 9<sup>th</sup> so it will be difficult to know what time there will be results. She indicated that the canvassing will be live streamed as suggested by the attorneys. She quoted from the legal memo that for health and safety purposes attendance should be limited to those individuals who are essential to the conduct of the vote and canvassing of the ballots.

This would include the District Clerk, inspectors who will be doing the work. Board of Education candidates or their designated poll watchers may also be present but should be required to wear an appropriate face covering and be positioned in a specific area and adhere to social distancing guidelines. The canvassing will take place in the high school library. There will be a meeting that evening which will be held in the chorus room. Dr. Seinfeld reminded the Board and community that ballots must be received by 5:00 P.M. on June 9<sup>th</sup> and urged the community to exercise their right to vote.

Dr. Seinfeld indicated that they had asked for any questions or comments from the community to the Board of Education be sent to Ms. Nolan in advance of the meeting. She read the correspondence to the Board which was a thank you for the planning and help in honoring the seniors at the parade and celebrating in different ways at this time.
