



- Our Philosophy
 - Provide AP-Level opportunities for all students willing to commit the time and effort associated with an AP course
 - 56% of sophomores took AP World in 2018-19
 - 54% of juniors took AP U.S. History in 2018-19
 - 43% of seniors took AP Government in 2018-19
 - AP Psychology is offered as an elective course



Our Goal

- Ensure every student is successful, both in terms of scores and in terms of skills acquired/developed.
- The definition of success varies for each student.
 - Student challenging themselves to take an AP vs. student enrolled in multiple AP classes
- Monitoring student progress through a baseline assessment and benchmark assessments to help identify issues and focus on specific needs.
 - Mock AP Exams



Our Results


LOW-INFERENCE FINDINGS

73% of OBHS students scored 3 or above (National Average 55%)
Highest Percentage of 5's in at least the past 7 years
Mean increased slightly even with a 19% enrollment increase




AP World History



% of students socring 3 or higher stayed the same 3% lower than the NYS % of scores of 3 or higher






2019 was first year of test redesign





- AP Mock Exams Early Spring
 - Piloted in 2018-19 with AP World and AP Psychology
 - Goal to add AP U.S. History in 2019-20
- Review Books Provided Earlier in the School Year
- Creation of AP Collegial Circles with support of the Long Island Council for Social Studies (LICSS) in AP World, AP U.S. and AP Government

- Teachers/Admin attend AP-Sponsored Workshops and Institutes frequently
- All AP teachers attended the Long Island Council for the Social Studies (LICSS) Conference in the fall of 2019
- AP teachers belong to online AP communities through Facebook and through the College Board
- Teacher taking part in AP Scoring for AP Government in Utah this Spring.
