Superintendent report:

Dr. Ianni reported that Oyster Bay High School was ranked #10 out of 500 schools according to a study in the 2021 Best Public High Schools in NY State. A leading panel of experts with decades of experience in education were consulted. They compared 1,200 public high schools across the state. The study is based on 4 categories: college readiness, school experience, diversity & teachers/staff. National Honor Society inductions/ceremonies are underway. Student recognition this evening is for achievement in Art. The Fine and Performing Arts Department put together a virtual art gallery showcasing all of the artistic talent at OBEN. Covid update: tents put up outside so students can enjoy lunch outside. Graduation update: Ms. Lasher is working hard to have our graduation ceremony. Regulations will be put in place. There will be 3 separate ceremonies. More end of year details will follow soon. Dr. Ianni thanked Mrs. Lasher for her hard work and enthusiasm in planning these events for our students. Assessment/Regents Update: At the HS level, in June, NYS Regents Exams will be administered in Algebra, Earth Science, Living Environment and ELA. All transcripts will have an E for exemption unless student requests grade to be sent to College. No scores included in final grade calculation. June 15, 16, 18 and 21 will be regular days of instruction. Grades 3-8 Assessment tests will be administered on April 20, 27 & May 4 & 7. Assessment comes in many different forms. State assessment is one piece of the puzzle. All types of assessment are viewed as a learning experience. It is very important to support our instructional systems to view assessment as a part of their learning experience.

BEDS code update: previously data reported from HS to state has been cumulative for grades 7-12. Dr. Mulhall has done tremendous work with the state to separate grades 7-12 into two separate BEDS codes (7&8 & 9&12). Having 2 separate BEDS codes for Oyster Bay-East Norwich will be more reflective of the students hard work. Dr. Ianni introduced Ms. Maureen Raynor who is on the agenda this evening to replace Dr. Mulhall as the New Deputy Superintendent of Schools.

Dr. Ianni introduced Mr. Femino who is here this evening for the Student Art Achievement. He thanked him and his staff for their hard work on all the virtual performances from the fine and performing arts department during the month of March. Mr. Femino recognized two Seniors for their outstanding achievement in Art. A slideshow of art work which was displayed at ASAA all county art exhibit and GO APE through the art league of LI was shown. Senior scholarship recipient was recognized & another Senior whose work is being displayed at Heckscher Museum. A photo was taken and students were presented with certificates. Mr. Femino thanked all art teachers for their commitment to the students.
