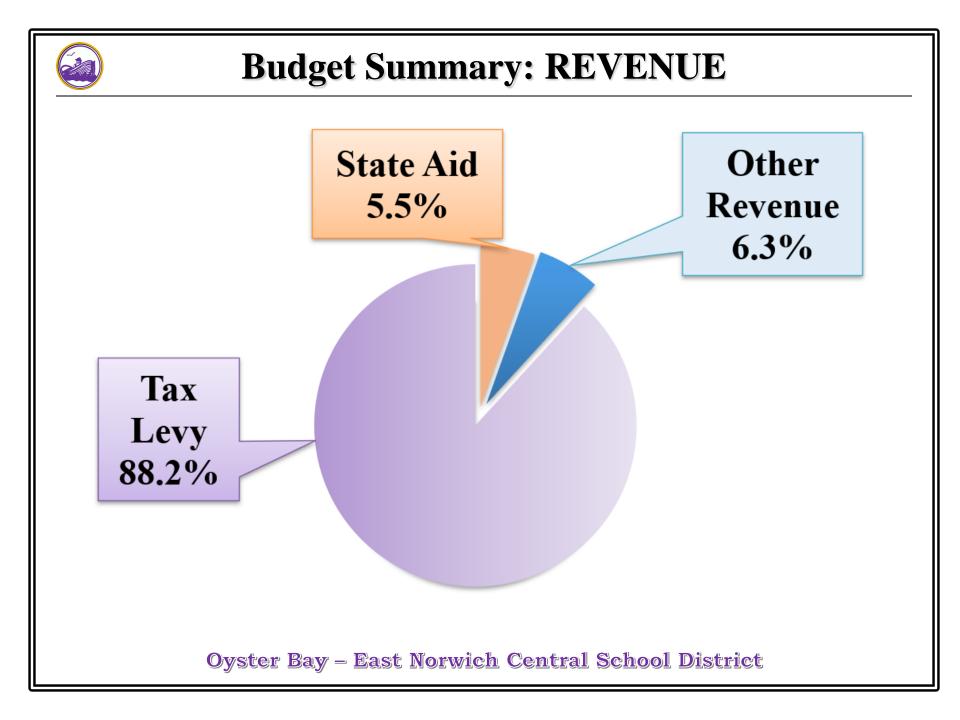


2023 – 2024 Budget Summary

For the 2023 – 2024 budget, the 'Allowable Tax Levy' is 2.34%.



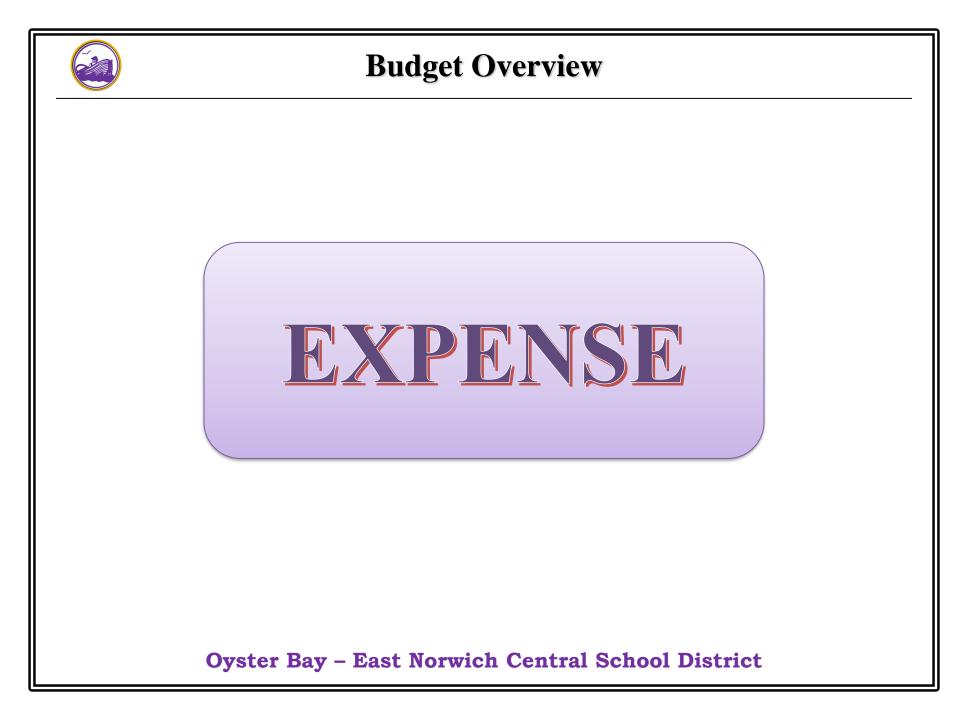

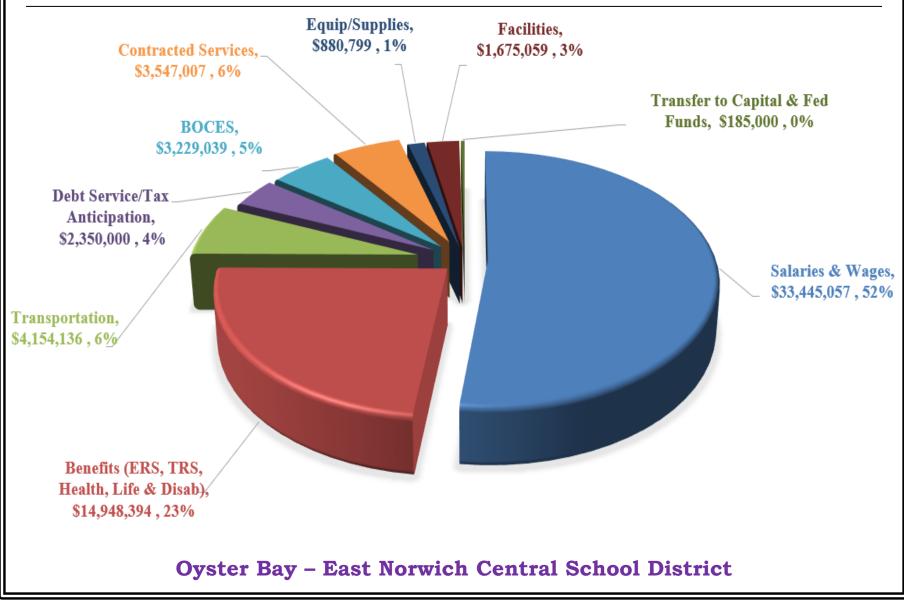

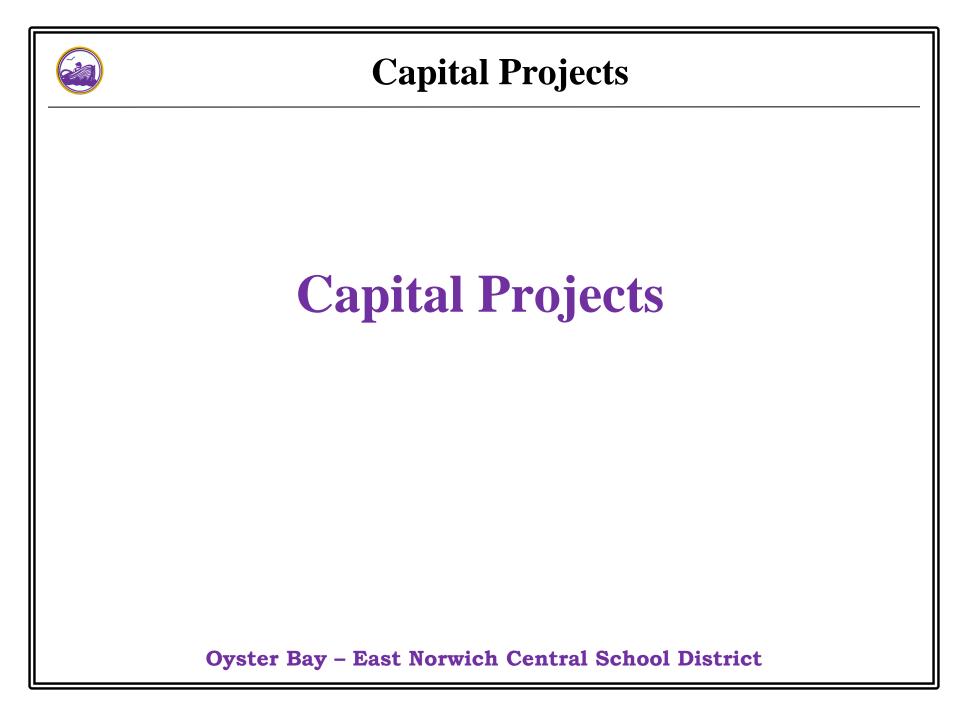

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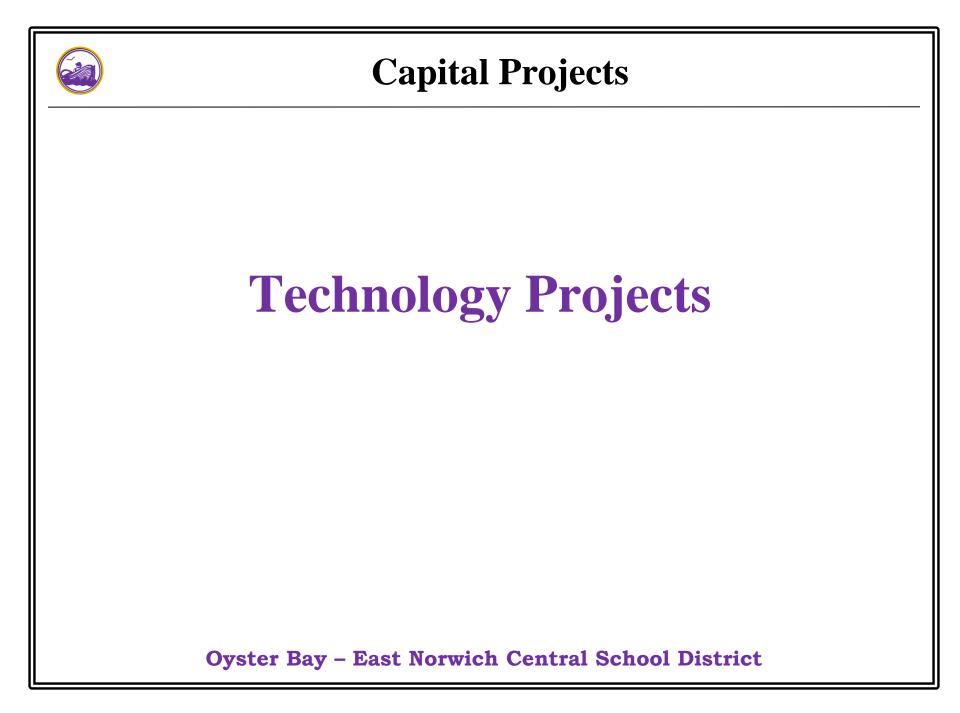

Ballot Propositions

PROPOSITION NO. 1 - School District Budget:

Authorizes the expenditure amount of **\$64,414,491** for the 2023-2024 Budget.

PROPOSITION NO. 2 (Technology Capital Reserve Fund Expenditure): Authorizes the expenditure from the District's **Technology Capital Reserve** Fund, for Board approved projects at an amount not to exceed Two Hundred Thousand Dollars (**\$200,000**). (At no cost to Taxpayers).

PROPOSITION NO. 3 (Capital Reserve Fund Expenditure):

Authorizes the expenditure from the District's **Capital Reserve** Fund, for Board approved projects at an amount not to exceed Seven Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (**\$750,000**). (At no cost to Taxpayers).

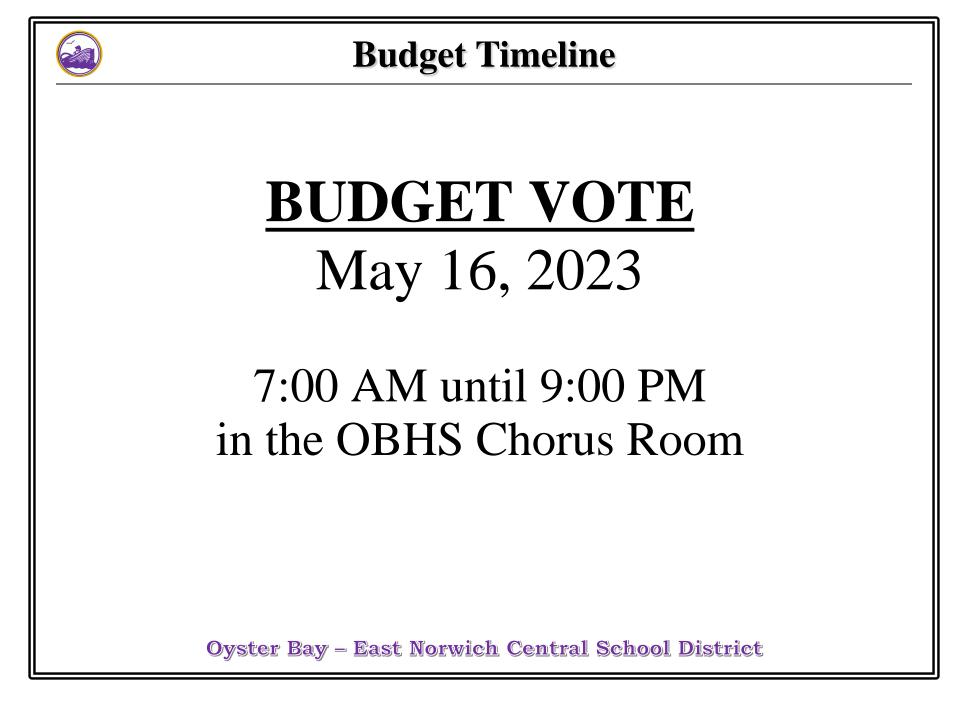
