ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS / READING

English Language Arts is aligned with the New York State Next Generation Learning Standards and Teachers College, Columbia University's philosophy. Students practice reading critically and writing purposefully.

READING

With a focus on fluency, accuracy, and comprehension, students read independently, in partnerships, and in book clubs. Units of study include but are not limited to:



- Character Study
- Non-Fiction: High-Interest & Content Area
- Book Clubs: Historical Fiction, Content Area, & Interpretation

WRITING

With a focus on process writing, students practice developing ideas, drafting, revising, and editing. Units of study include but are not limited to:

• Fiction: Personal & Historical

• Essays: Literary & Argument

• Information

In addition, students are prepared for the New York State English Language Arts Assessment.

MATHEMATICS

The mathematics curriculum is aligned with the New York State Next Generation Learning Standards and encompasses a variety of both computational and conceptual skills. Topics include:



- Place Value
- Represent and Interpret Data
- Geometry and Measurement
- Multi-Digit Multiplication and Division
- Fractions and Decimals

In addition, students are prepared for the New York State Mathematics Assessment.

SCIENCE

Students will apply scientific and engineering practices to explore and explain scientific phenomena. Throughout the year, students will develop an understanding of and make connections between the following core disciplinary ideas:



- Energy
- Earth: Features and Processes
- Waves and Information
- Life: Structures and Functions

SOCIAL STUDIES

The social studies curriculum in fourth grade focuses on New York State and local communities and their changes over time, incorporating the study of geography, history, economics, and government.

Topics include:



- Native Americans
- Early Explorers
- Colonial Life
- American Revolution
- New York State Government & Economics
- Rights and Freedoms
- Industrial Revolution & New Technology
- Immigration

Skill Development:

- Maps, timelines, graphs, & diagrams
- Cause/Effect relationships

MUSIC

Students develop musical skills as well as an appreciation of music through:



- Integration into subject area curriculum
- Classroom instrument instruction and vocal instruction focusing on creating, performing, and responding in a music community setting
- Music history

ART

Students demonstrate their creativity in a variety of ways and develop artistic skills by:



- Making use of the materials and resources available for creation of arts
- Response to a variety of artistic works in the arts and connections to other artists
- Using different techniques and color mixing to create abstract art
- Study of famous artists and their work as inspiration
- Freely exploring a variety of materials for each project

LIBRARY MEDIA

Designed to encourage students' curiosity, the library program equips students with the skills they need to explore the world through literature and research.



- Students learn to navigate the library and use its resources.
- Students learn to locate and critique sources of information.
- Students learn to create multimedia presentations.

TECHNOLOGY


